Overview

Senator Michael Bennet is a staunch advocate for bipartisan, enduring action to protect our climate and simultaneously strengthening energy independence. While in the Senate, he has passed more than 100 pieces of legislation, often with bipartisan support (he is ranked as the 29th most bipartisan Senator in the most recent report by the Lugar Center). Senator Bennet was in private industry before becoming Superintendent of Denver Public Schools, where he served from 2005 to 2009, when he entered the US Senate.

Positions on Energy and Climate

Senator Bennet has been very clear on his views regarding climate change. He advocates for practical solutions that work within our existing systems; for example by helping farmers move toward carbon-storing practices. Further, he has introduced legislation that would create long-term sustainable funding for communities that have historically relied on revenue from fossil fuel energy production.

Senator Bennet views climate change as a major issue that we must address quickly and has said "Climate issues are here today." Without action against climate change, we will leave a less safe and healthy planet for our children and future generations, saying "We are being overrun by climate change." He has repeatedly said that he will work with anyone to break through the current gridlock in Washington surrounding the climate, while he knows that there must be a transition from our current economy which is dependent on fossil fuels to one with a modern energy system, with low-cost renewables, strengthened energy independence, strong domestic supply chains, and reliable, clean, and affordable energy.

Why we support Senator Michael Bennet

Michael Bennet is a leader in the Senate, actively seeking durable and meaningful legislation to address climate change. He works across the aisle, with a focus on finding bipartisan solutions that have a meaningful impact on reducing carbon emissions.
